



# Youth Voice Census

## Lesson Plan

This lesson plan will help you show students how to complete the Youth Voice Census and have a positive impact on the future employment and support prospects of young people in the UK.

<b>Time needed</b>	20-45 minutes
<b>Suitable for</b>	Open to all ages from 11-30 year olds
<b>Lesson plan overview</b>	In this lesson your learners will be guided through how to complete the Youth Voice Census, which takes 20-45 minutes, and be a part of the national picture.

	The Youth Voice Census is a national survey for young people and gives young people the chance to have their say on a range of issues affecting their lives.
<b>Learning Outcomes</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• To understand why taking part is so valuable.</li> <li>• To complete the online survey and add student voices to the thousands of young people across the UK taking part in the Youth Voice Census.</li> </ul>

<b>Timing guidance</b>	Tasks/content descriptions
<b>5 Minutes</b>	<p><b>Starter/Arrival activity:</b></p> <p>Watch the video for the 2023 Youth voice Census and take learners through the findings of the last Census.</p> <p>Links:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <a href="#">Youth Voice Census 2023 PowerPoint</a></li> <li>• <a href="#">Youth Voice Census 2023 YouTube Link</a></li> </ul>

	<p><b>Accompanying notes</b> - The Youth Voice Census will ask a range of questions about you and your experiences in education, training, work and in everyday life.</p> <p>Your answers could make a big difference to how the UK government, employers and educators support young people. It's a great way to add your voice and make sure your opinion gets heard by people who make the rules.</p> <p>Youth Employment UK will use the information to create public reports on how young people in general view study and employment today, but don't worry - your personal information will not be shared!</p> <p>By adding your voice you can help to create the most accurate picture possible of exactly what young people are feeling right now.</p> <p>This picture is shared with:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Government departments - to help shape real changes in our country.</li> <li>• Employers up and down the UK - to help them understand what you need and expect in terms of getting great support when it's time to think about jobs and careers</li> <li>• Organisations who want to help - after all, without your voice, they don't know what you <i>really</i> care about in life.</li> </ul>
<p><b>Main activity task - Examples for you to use</b></p>	
<p><b>15 -40 minutes</b></p>	<p>Complete the Youth Voice Census survey!</p> <p>Log into the website here to take part in the survey - <a href="http://s.alchemer.eu/s3/Youth-Voice-Census-2023">http://s.alchemer.eu/s3/Youth-Voice-Census-2023</a></p>

	<p>The process is very simple. There is no need to register to the website and all responses are completely anonymous. If you don't get time to complete it in one session, you can complete at your own pace at home.</p> <p>Log into the link above and you will be taken to the start of the survey. At the bottom of each screen is a 'next' button. Simply complete the questions on the page and click 'next' until you complete the survey.</p> <p>As you answer questions, other sections may or may not be triggered depending on your responses, so completion time can vary from student to student.</p>
<p><b>2 minutes</b></p>	<p><b>Group share</b></p> <p>How did you find the Youth Voice Census? Share some of your experiences with your classmates.</p> <p>What are your thoughts about the questions being asked?</p> <p>Why do you think it's important for organisations offering support and policy makers to know about the issues young people face?</p> <p>Are there questions you think the Youth Voice Census should also have covered?</p>
