# Together we can make a difference...

Research and experience tell us it can be difficult for young people to understand the importance of getting work experience. Qualifications alone can't always clinch that job, but work experience can help.

### Key campaign messages

# Work experience matters to recruiters and employers:

- **57%** of employers cite a lack of soft skills on a young person's CV as the reason they don't get the job.
- **76%** of employers say lack of work experience is the reason young people are unprepared for work.
- Any work-related experience can be good experience even if it's not what you want to do long term.
- A week or fortnight in a care or admin role (for example) can help a young person to **evidence their soft skills** such as timekeeping, initiative, teamwork, organisational skills and communication to name a few.
