# Why is it important to support young people in school



**Young people as a group are still 3 times more likely to be unemployed than any other group**

**Young people often tell us they find the transition hard between education and employment. And that they wished that they had someone to talk to, even better someone like them to talk to**

Depending on what you are delivering we may need to work together to create a specific resource.



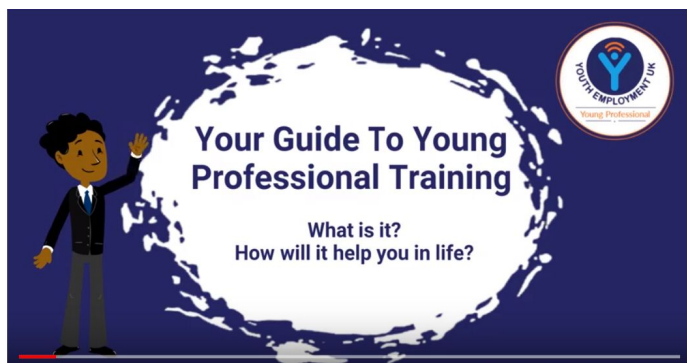


# Making contact with schools and organising a session



1. Get in touch with a local school, college or youth group
2. Via email or phone, explain who you are and that you are looking to support students
3. Agree the day and format of the session, be sure to confirm the following
  - a. how many students
  - b. the year group
  - c. the timings
  - d. if they have access to IT, presentation equipment
4. Follow up with a confirmation and copy in the YEUK team
5. Follow through with your commitments

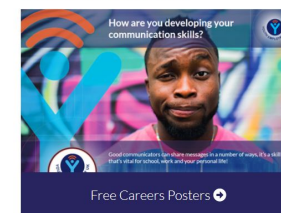
