Envisioning Talent



Helicopters play an essential role in humanitarian missions, both at home and overseas. Helicopter design and development is often referred to as 'rotorcraft' technology by aerospace professionals. With such a different way of flying compared with conventional aeroplanes, enabling versatility and agility in the air, helicopters have become essential for both civil and military operations. All three UK armed forces use helicopters – the RAF, the Royal Navy and the Army Air Corps and they are vital to police operations and the coast-guard via the RAF Search and Rescue Force. It takes more than the Pilot to keep them in the air.

What is a Paramedic?

A **Paramedic** is a health care professional whose primary role is to provide advanced emergency medical care for critical and emergent patients.

Did you know not all ambulance personnel are paramedics?

Your training as a student paramedic covers all you need to know to become a fully-qualified paramedic. This includes driver training, communication, emergency first aid, anatomy and physiology.

"You study for a qualification in **Paramedical Science** as well as doing practical work under supervision. The length of training varies between NHS ambulance services—usually between two and five years".





Knowing Your Services Past, Equips You For Their Future

Dstl recruits apprentices across a variety of areas. In 2021 they included:

- electronic engineering
- ordnance, munitions and explosives
- cyber security
- commercial procurement
- facilities management
- business administration
- project management
- Software engineering

Apprentice salaries, first year apprentice salaries range from £14,358 to £27,010, depending on the apprenticeship level, and rise each year of employment. Apprentices also have access to a range of employee benefits. Dstl's apprentices are forging successful careers in engineering, science and technology, and management.


Unlock Your Potential
