Youth Friendly Prime Minister Charter

As a candidate to the next Prime Minister I will be working towards fulfilling the following principles:

Creating Opportunities

- I will provide a 'Young Person's Guarantee' to ensure that all young people have access to quality employment, education or training.
- I will ensure that the skills taught in schools, further education and higher education prepares young people for the demands and future demands of the labour market.
- I will promote high-quality careers education in schools and ensure that all school leavers have the skills, confidence and knowledge to find employment.

Recognising Talent

- I will recognise the talent and resilience of young people as an asset to the labour market
- I will ensure that all young people, regardless of their background, are given the opportunity to reach their full potential through education, employment and training.

Fair Employment

- I will ensure that young people are treated fairly in the work they do.
- I will provide guidance to employers on how to be a youth friendly employer and recognise the Good Youth Employment Charter as best practice.
- I will work with industry and business leaders to create roles and opportunities that meet the diverse needs of young people.

Developing People

- I will support quality learning and development opportunities for all young people, advocating education and training pathways that meet the needs and aspirations of the individual.
- I will ensure that young people are given opportunities to be active, contributing citizens to society.
- I will ensure that young people leave education with relevant, up to date skills and confidence in financial and digital literacy.

Youth Voice

- I will listen to and respond to young people's views and experiences from all backgrounds.
- I will empower young people to make meaningful contributions to policy areas that affect them directly

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
