This lesson plan will help support students with applying for an apprenticeship, including looking for an apprenticeship and completing their application.

Please note that this lesson can be adapted for your learners, including timings and activities.

Slide 2

Go through the aims of the session.

Starter/Arrival activity:

Ask students to tell their partner 3 things they want to know about apprenticeships by the end of the lesson.

Main Activity Task

Talk through what an apprenticeship is with your students, and the different types available.

Question Opportunity - What are the benefits of an apprenticeship?

5 minutes

Slides 4 - 5 Finding an Apprenticeship

Talk through the different options that young people have to find an apprenticeship, including GOV.UK'S Find an Apprenticeship, Youth Employment UK Apprenticeship Finder, employer websites, training provider websites, UCAS Apprenticeship Finder, and job boards.

Optional - Demo using the GOV.UK Find an Apprenticeship site and Youth Employment UK's Apprenticeship Finder

Slides 6 - 8 **Applying for an Apprenticeship**

Talk through information on how to apply for an apprenticeship

Timing guidance	Slide Number	Tasks/content descriptions
15 minutes	Slide 9 - 10	Share print outs for a L3 Activity Leader Apprenticeship advert. For the first 10 minutes, ask students to read through and highlight what skills and qualities this employer is looking for based on the information in the advert. For the final 5 minutes, share their thoughts and compare with the skills highlighted on slide 11.
5 Minutes	Slides 11 - 12	Applying for an apprenticeship Talk through key points students should consider when applying for an apprenticeship.
2 minutes	Slide 13	Share top tips with students for applying for an apprenticeship
2 minutes	Slide 14	Next Step Talk through information on preparing for an interview or assessment centre as part of the recruitment process.
1 minute	Slide 14	Ask students to reflect on today's learning objectives



Extension or follow up tasks:

- Students can explore apprenticeship opportunities near them on Youth Employment UK's Apprenticeship Finder
